This article was originally published in printed form. The journal began in 1973 and was titled *The Aboriginal Child at School*. In 1996 the journal was transformed to an internationally peer-reviewed publication and renamed *The Australian Journal of Indigenous Education*.

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Several guest lectures were delivered by visiting politicians, educationalists and community workers. Senator N. Bonner lectured on "Aboriginal Land Rights"; Mrs. Kath Walker spoke on "Aboriginal Culture and Identity", and Professor Betty Watts discussed "Teaching Strategies in Aboriginal Education".

The Aboriginal Studies course, co-ordinated by Peter Wicks, Lecturer in Humanities at the Darling Downs Institute of Advanced Education, is continuing in 1975. Such courses can be expected to facilitate the development of teachers who are sensitive and responsive to the needs of Aboriginal students.

Teachers who undertook courses such as this during their initial teacher education are invited to send in their comments, particularly in the light of their teaching experience since graduation.
