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THE ABORIGINAL HEALTH WORKER

Our readers will be interested to know that the office which produces *The Aboriginal Child at School* is, from this year, producing a further journal, *The Aboriginal Health Worker*, edited by Dr John Cawte, Prince Henry Hospital, Little Bay, New South Wales, and supported by the Department of Aboriginal Affairs, Canberra.

This journal will be issued four times a year, and it is intended to assist Aboriginal Health Workers in three ways :

1. To diagnose and treat sick individuals.
2. To interpret sickness, its causes and its prevention to the local community.
3. To educate the Australian public, since many decisions affecting Aboriginal health do not rest with health workers.

The Aboriginal Health Worker aims at increasing involvement of Aborigines and Islanders in all aspects of their health and adjustment, most especially in training and leadership roles.

Although *The Aboriginal Child at School* has, as you know, moved this year on to a subscription basis, this is not the case with *The Aboriginal Health Worker*.
