



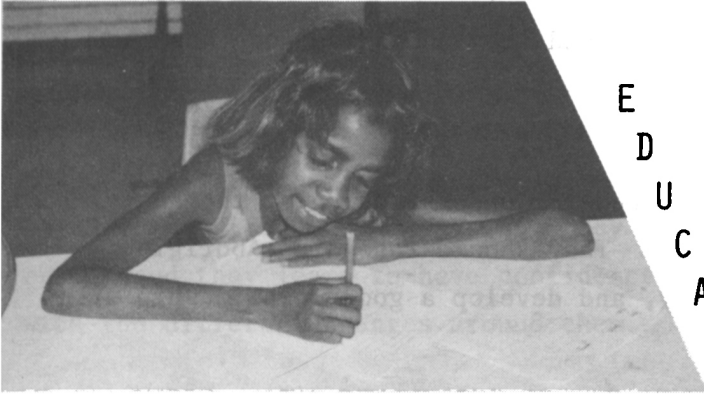

C - Concentrate on your work at school

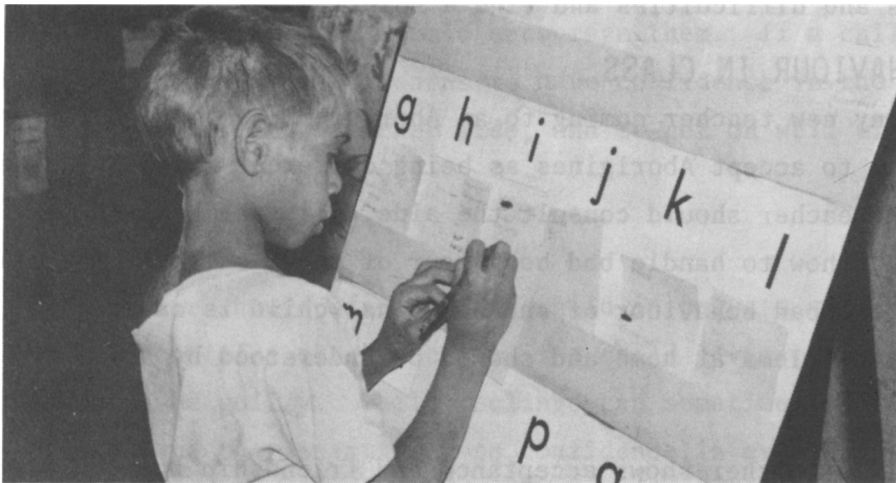
A - Attend school regularly
