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## YIPIRINYA SCHOOL - ALICE SPRINGS

Yipirinya School is an independent, community controlled Aboriginal school serving town camps in and around Alice Springs. The school is structured to ensure Aboriginal control is positively supported and is currently developing three Aboriginal language programs and a traditional culture program. An Accredited teacher training program will be taught on site in 1990. Yipirinya School is going through a very exciting phase in its development and requires suitably qualified and experienced people for the following positions, available from Term 1, 1990:

**CURRICULUM CO-ORDINATOR** - This is a senior administrative position which is responsible for: . the supervision and support of the school programs; . facilitating the development of curricula; . the establishment of a pre-school program; . consulting the School Council about matters which concern the school programs and the welfare of the children.

*Knowledge of and experience in education is desirable.*

### TEACHER LINGUIST

This position involves working with Central Arrente, Western Arrente and Luritja teachers and literacy workers to develop appropriate resources and programs for the middle primary, upper primary and post-primary Aboriginal language programs. The position also carries responsibility for the professional and personal development of skills required by the Aboriginal teachers and literacy workers.

### LOWER PRIMARY TEACHER

This position carries responsibility for the planning and implementation of an oral English program for children who speak Aboriginal languages and an early childhood program for the children who speak English enrolled in the lower primary stream.

### UPPER PRIMARY TEACHER (E.S.L.)

This position carries responsibility for planning and implementing an upper primary program to be taught in English.
